This situation demands a thorough discussion on the value of security vis à vis peace by scholars, practitioners and those who want to follow in their footsteps - or pioneer new paths towards peace and security. Are military interventions legitimate policies in the name of peace and future security? Are modern forms of warfare, e.g. drone strikes and cyber-attacks, more likely to contribute to peace and security in the long run because of an expected decrease in human casualties?
